Item 1. ORD 2019-63: ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SERVICE DIRECTOR TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT FOR THE LEASE OF CERTAIN FARM LANDS ADJACENT TO THE MARION MUNICIPAL AIRPORT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY (Airport, Lands and Buildings, Mr. Huddle, 3-0 recommendation)

Matt Arnold, Director of Aviation, stated that 3 valid bids were received to farm 577 acres for the 2020 crop year. The best bid was from Todd Etgen (Ashley, Ohio), as selected by Airport Commission for a three-year lease at \$267 per acre, a \$33 increase over previous rate. Once approved, they will enter into contract within 10 days. Mayor Schertzer clarified that the high bid is the best bid as this is revenue, not an expense.

## **OTHER MATTERS NOT ON THE AGENDA:**

Mayor Schertzer announced that the US Census Bureau is seeing Census workers. It is important to get an accurate count of all citizens. That count is tied to federal dollars received by the City. He also wished everyone a happy Thanksgiving. He is grateful for the commitment to community shown by elected officials.

Joe Jacubic from First Energy announced that citizens should beware of phone scammers. He advised citizens to always call back (do not rely on an incoming call even if the phone number appears accurate).

Dan Neidig (333 Forest Lawn Blvd.) extended an invitation to council and the public to attend the next Board of Zoning Appeals meeting on 12/10 at 6:30PM (Tuesday). He stated that there are a lot of things that happen at meetings and the more that council knows about the legislation and codes they write and more about whole process will be helpful. He explained that members receive a report on property and sometimes do a site visit. The "planning committee" has a chance to tell them their recommendation. Do you know what the planning committee is doing and how that is affecting the city? He is the "question person" and likes to ask questions at these meetings. If Council knows more, they will be asking questions and so will the people in your ward. They try to make a determination. Thing that gets him the most, they need to know how this is going to affect the people in your city and your ward. Are they representing you and what you think that they should be doing? The board is the last group that says yes or no, and Council does not know what is going on in your ward. He looks at it differently. He looks beyond how it will affect his ward, but how it will affect others. He wants to make sure it is not just short term. When they make these decisions, then people do not understand why they cannot do something because someone else did it. Why can't we? He thinks all should come to meeting and see how this thing works.
