MEET CHARLOTTE ROWE

Over 10 years ago, Charlotte Rowe started coming to the Marion Senior Center to get away. Charlotte first came to the center to take advantage of trips it offers. Then about nine years ago, a friend and neighbor talked her into going to choir practice at the center and she's been hooked ever since.

"Anita Vaflor is great at bringing out the best in everyone," Charlotte explained. "The center's trips got me started, but the choir got me here weekly."

Charlotte still participates in the choir, coming out to practice every Tuesday, and has added playing bridge every Monday to her schedule. "I LOVE that," Charlotte said, talking about playing bridge at the center.

In addition to taking part in the center's many activities, Charlotte also continues a commitment she made under Sue Wisebaker to represent the center in the Area Agency on Aging. A multi-cultural organization, the group meets every other month. "Marion is one county represented," explained Charlotte. "I try to promote what's going on in Marion County for seniors and learn about other opportunities available in the area. Annette attends the meetings too."

In addition, Charlotte, an RN, also fills in when needed to help with the center's monthly blood pressure screenings. "I fill in or substitute for the regular nurse," she said, adding that the screenings are available the first Monday of each month.

The variety of activities available at the senior center is what Charlotte likes best. "I like the multiple opportunities," she explained. "There are so many learning opportunities whether you're a singer, a dancer or a crafty person. The people that you meet out here are wonderful too."

Originally from metropolitan New Jersey, Charlotte followed her future husband to a dairy farm in



Cardington in 1970. "How's that for true love," she laughed. "I tell friends I ruralized with no problem. When my mom would come to visit, she couldn't believe how friendly everyone was. She couldn't believe how you could be standing in line at the grocery and everyone's talking to each other."

Charlotte has been widowed for 10 years. She has two sons. One son is unmarried and lives in Columbus. Her other son and his wife live in San Marcos, CA. She has no grandchildren, but does have three grand-dogs.

Charlotte lives in a condominium and serves on the Condo Association's Board of Directors. "This year I became treasurer of the board," she added.

She also swims at the YMCA and plays duplicate bridge as a sub for the Marion Duplicate Bridge Club.

A registered nurse, Charlotte started working at Community Memorial Hospital in 1971 and retired from Marion General Hospital in 2007.

When she's not spending time at the Marion Senior Center, Charlotte volunteers with Marion General Hospice. "I love that," she said. "Most every volunteer will tell you that even though they are put in unusual circumstances, they get back much more than they give.

"It's a very special opportunity and I'm fortunate to be a part of people's lives during these times."
